## The PEPS Experience


PEPS parents who completed the post-group survey (n = 496) rated their satisfaction and shared if they would recommend PEPS to other parents.

The research-based <u>Strengthening Families™ framework</u> identifies five protective factors that are critical to family resilience and well-being. To measure the impact in these five factors, 248 parents rated how they felt they were doing in these areas before and after participating in their PEPS Group.

Respondents showed a positive increase in how they were feeling about their parenting before participating in PEPS to after in all five protective factors, most notably for child development support.
