The PEPS Experience

PEPS parents who completed the post-group survey (n = 488) rated their satisfaction and shared if they would recommend PEPS to other parents.



These findings suggest that most parents had a positive experience with their 2023 PEPS groups.





Participants found the most valuable aspect of their PEPS Group was...

PEPS has helped me know that other fathers are going through the same thing.

It's so good to talk to other people going through the same thing at the same time, and be able to share the ups and downs with them. It's calmed a lot of my fears. Also, the things I've learned from the development moments have been very helpful."



...it's a community to share ideas, tips, challenges — and more. Really, nothing is off the table. PEPS has normalized all of the challenging aspects of being a new parent, and in doing so I became more accepting of the challenges rather than trying to eliminate them. This radical shift in my approach made me less anxious and more open to fully embracing all that is involved...

The Impact on PEPS Families

The research-based <u>Strengthening Families™ framework</u> identifies five protective factors that are critical to family resilience and well-being. To measure the impact in these five factors, 274 parents rated how they felt they were doing in these areas before and after participating in their PEPS Group.

Respondents showed a positive increase in how they were feeling about their parenting before participating in PEPS to after in all five protective factors, most notably for child development and information support.
